The Agricultural Policy Research Network (APRNet) has developed a medium-term strategic plan known as APRNet's Strategy and Programme Framework (SPF) 2012-2016. The SPF is essentially a policy and operational document that mirrors the priorities, direction, strategies and programme thrusts of APRNet over the next 5 years. It also provides the methodology and guiding framework for achieving our programmatic activities within the given timeframe.

The strategy formulation workshop was held on 15 March 2012 in Abuja. It was based on the participatory approach involving key stakeholders. The Strategy and Programme Framework is designed to become the basis for annual operating work plans and budgets. We congratulate the president and his team for successfully articulating the first strategic plan for the Network and encourage members to support its implementation.

The key objects and criteria that formed the basis for the online review of the federal government budget include the following:

- Key macroeconomic assumptions and principles as they relate to or affect agricultural and rural development;
- Synergy between agricultural policy/programmes (Agricultural Transformation Agenda) and the proposed budget;
 Structure, appropriateness and adequacy of the agricultural and rural development sector budget allocations;
- Adequacy and relevance of the agriculture-related institutional reform, monetary, trade and fiscal policy measures proposed in the budget, for example, tariffs, trade, import duties, export duties, agricultural credit and finance; and
- Any other issues or considerations pertinent to making the budget better aligned to promoting agricultural and rural development in the country.

We use this forum to congratulate members for contributing immensely to the online dialogue and encourage others to join the league.

APRNet Provides Strategic Inputs into the Design of Nigeria's Agricultural Value Chain Development Programme.

The Agricultural Policy Research Network (APRNet) has provided substantial technical inputs to the design of the Agricultural Value Chain Development Programme of Nigeria's Agricultural Transformation Agenda. This was made possible by APRNet's participation in the Stakeholders Workshop on the Staple Crops Processing Zones held between 31st January and 1st February 2013 in Abuja. The workshop which conducted a SWOT (Strengths, Weakness, Opportunities and Threats) analysis of the value chain benefitted immensely from APRNet's technical expertise as adequately reflected in the Programmes' Logical Framework. The workshop brought together key stakeholders in the agriculture sector including the African Development Bank (AfDB) which is currently supporting the agricultural value chain with the sum of \$150 million.

Progress towards Programme Implementation

APRNet made vital progress in consultations and mobilisation towards two activities in the 2012/2013 work programme. They are:

- The 2nd National Symposium on "Making Agricultural Research Work for End-Users": The progress includes making contacts with and securing the interests of the respective National Agricultural Research Institutes for their participation. Also, progress was made on the preparation and review of agenda topics and subtopics for the Symposium.
- Policy Analysis Training for APRNet core team: Important progress was made on the agenda of a training course for enhancing skills and competencies in policy analysis within APRNet. The brochure stating the rationale, objectives and expected impacts of the "Policy Analysis and Impact Assessment Classroom" (PAIAC) for APRNet is under preparation.
- Agenda for Training on Using Research in Policymaking: Progress is being made to develop a menu of topics and issues for a possible training of government officials (federal and state) on the use of research information (findings and recommendations) for policymaking and programme planning. The training initiative is designed to promote evidence-based policymaking from the demand-side.
